Sophia brought MI the first individual girls title in program history, and I believe ran the 5<sup>th</sup> fastest time ever on that course. Knowing her competitive spirit she will undoubtedly be working her way up that list her next 3 years. Absolutely outstanding performance. And not to be outdone by his teammate, Owen added a XC state title to his 1600 track title while smiling and chatting with his friends along the way. He raced his friendly rival from Blanchet stride for stride until tightening the screws with 400 to go and sealing his win, running the fastest time of the whole day, despite very slick course conditions. This is not news to any of you reading this, but they are two incredible, humble and fun athletes and do our program proud.
